DESCRIPTION

GENERAL RULES FOR ALL CLASSICAL GUITAR CLASSES

• One of the selections must have been performed at the Local Festival and received a minimum mark of 85 and the recommendation of the local Adjudicator.

• The second selection is the competitor's choice but **may not be another movement** from the first selection.

• Graded Level Classes are for competitors studying in either the Royal Conservatory of Music (RCM) or Conservatory Canada (CC) syllabus will participate through a Virtual Festival.

• One original score of the music or purchased digital music with attached receipt for each selection must be shown on camera prior to the beginning of the performance.

• Only YouTube videos will be permitted (i.e. google drives, vimeo, mp3's, mp4's, dropbox etc. are not permitted). Each performance requires a separate YouTube link. Performance videos should not be combined.

PERFORMANCE REQUIREMENTS

- a) Both selections must be at the same level and at the level at which the competitor is currently studying. If the competitor has taken an exam prior to December 31st, 2023, then they cannot enter that level.
- b) Please note that unlike RCM and CC exam requirements, both selections must be the same grade/level for the Provincial Competition.
- c) Memorization is not required but is highly recommended.
- d) "Teacher's Choice" pieces are not permitted.
- e) Selections must be musically contrasting. The Adjudicator will take the choice of repertoire into consideration.
- f) One or more movements of a multi-movement work will be recognized as one selection only.



- g) Competitors must refer carefully to either the RCM or CC syllabus to determine how many and which movements of a selection are required (i.e. one mvt., two mvts., or complete). Failure to play the required movements could result in disqualification.
- h) Studies/Etudes, as listed in the RCM or CC syllabi, will be permitted. However, only one (1) of the pieces selected may be a Study/Etude. Popular pieces may not be substituted.
- i) Accompaniment must be by acoustic piano only. Unless a piece is specifically written to be unaccompanied it must have accompaniment or the submission will be for adjudication only.
- j) If you do not have a collaborative pianist (accompanist), the people on this list **(click here)** have indicated that they are willing to help out by providing live or recorded accompaniments. It is up to the competitor to contact them directly and pay for this arrangement.
- k) All criteria listed in the OMFA General Rules (hyperlink required) must be strictly adhered to.

Fiddle - Solo

Recognized fiddle styles include but are not limited to: **Country, Old Time, Cape Breton, Swing, Métis, Bluegrass, French Canadian** etc.

Fiddle classes require progress from one style of piece to another without pause.

Piece Selections

- a) The selection must have been performed at the Local Festival and received a minimum mark of 85 and the recommendation of the local Adjudicator.
- b) Pieces must represent Canadian fiddling styles and place emphasis on **traditional fiddling elements.** c) Contrasting tunes can be played in one style (e.g. contrasting Old-Time tunes) or in any number of variety of styles (e.g. Bluegrass, Cape Breton jig, Old-Time Waltz).
- d) Fiddle classes require progress from one style of piece to another without pause.
- e) Classical, jazz, blues, trick fiddling, show tunes and other non-traditional fiddle styles are not permitted. ('Double shuffle' is acceptable if it is a traditional part of the song).

- h) Adjudicators will consider the following criteria: intonation, technical proficiency, overall accuracy, danceability, expression and emotion, and the variety of tunes, whether from one specific fiddle style or a variety of styles.

Speech Arts - Duets and Trios

- f) Full costume is not necessary. A suggestion of a costume (hat, shawl, jacket, vest) is sufficient.
- g) Minimal, hand-held stage props are allowed.
- h) For the purpose of this competition:
- Adult & Child duets: Adult is defined as anyone over the age of 19 speaking alongside a younger child.
- i) All competitors must be an **amateur** which shall be defined as any person whose principle means of livelihood is not obtained from the performance or teaching of music in the particular category in which they are competing, even though, from time to time, they may receive remuneration on an occasional basis (not full-time). Please click here for the full definition of Amateur vs Professional: https://omfa.ca/glossary
- j) All criteria listed in the OMFA General Rules (https://omfa.ca/virtual-festival/rules-regulations) must be strictly adhered to.

- j) Video must be submitted by your Local Festival's entry deadline date for Provincials.
- k) One original script with scene or excerpt, clearly marked or highlighted, (or printed text citing title, author and source) must be shown on camera prior to the beginning of the performance.

- p) The video should be in the spirit of a recital or an audition and therefore you should dress appropriately.

- The Name of author, playwright or poet, and name of larger work (if applicable)

Speech Arts Selections and Resources

The RCM Speech Arts Syllabus is a good resource for examples of poetry and prose excerpts for all age levels.

You may select your selection from one of the following categories:

Poetry- (Lyric, Narrative, Humorous, Canadian, Original, Slam):

- Lyric Poetry a short poem that is contemplative, an expression of the inner thoughts and feelings of the poet. It includes sonnets, odes and elegies. Selections exhibit a graceful musical rhythm and flow. The content is reflective and emotional, typically written in the first person, and the story element is of secondary importance to the emotion/feeling. Not dramatized. No (or limited) movement or gestures so that attention is never drawn away from the language. (Examples include select works of Dickinson, Shelley, Keats, Rossetti, Tagore, etc.)
- Narrative Poetry— a poem that tells a story, or recounts an event, through verse. It contains a plot, characters, and a setting. It often contains action and dialogue but is told from the narrator's perspective. Usually written in metered verse but does not need to rhyme. Gestures are allowed for emphasis but it is not dramatized. Any movement should flow naturally from the text and the narrator's interpretation. (Examples include select works of Poe, Longfellow, Tennyson, St. Vincent Millay, etc.)
- Humorous Poetry– a light or humorous poem (examples include select works of Roald Dahl, Shel Silverstein, Ogden Nash, etc.)
- Canadian Poetry a published poem written by a Canadian/Indigenous poet. (Examples include select works of Roberts, Service, Carson, Lampman, Atwood, Cohen, Montgomery, Ondaatje, Thomas, etc.)
- Original Poetry— Competitors perform their own original poem from memory. Performance will be assessed on content, delivery, creativity and originality.
- Slam Poetry Original spoken-word poetry that is performance-based, rhythmic, passionate and has a "rise" (climax). Slam poetry makes a clear statement or point on a theme or subject

people can relate to. Hip hop music and urban culture are strong influences in this style. Performance will be assessed on content, enthusiasm and style. Props, costumes and music are not allowed. (A recommended resource: Poetry Slam by Gary Glazner).

Prose – An excerpt (in paragraph form) from a published story, novel, or essay (fiction or nonfiction). The passage may be abridged to form a unified whole. Prose is non-metrical writing and thus, stories written in verse are not permitted. Selection should include narration, description and dialogue. It should be spoken in a story-telling style and not performed as a dramatic scene. No acting and limited movement around the stage. Competitors may stand or be seated.

- Fiction Prose
- Non-Fiction Prose
- Humorous Prose
- Canadian Prose

Shakespeare Duologue – choice of a scene or play by William Shakespeare.

Duologue Other Than Shakespeare – a scene depicting characters from a published play or published anthology of monologues. Scene may be abridged so that the duologue includes only the words of two or three characters. Simple portable props and simple costuming are allowed.

Storytelling – competitors may write their own original story, or retell, in their own words, a folk, fairy tale, myth or legend.

Public Speaking – competitors will prepare and present an original organized speech on a topic of their choice. Content must be suitable for all ages/audiences. The speech should have a defined purpose and clear structure. The speech may be delivered to entertain, influence, or inform the audience. Cue cards are permitted, but eye contact should engage the audience.

Mime – Own choice from an original or a published work. Mime is a silent art form that uses body and face as instruments of communication and expression so as to express a mood or present a scenario. Performance may take place in silence, be accompanied by recorded music or live music. Competitors must clearly communicate character, storyline, location and emotion. Economy of movement, eye focus, ability to position objects and maintain consistency of distance are vital. Simple costumes are allowed.

Stand-Up Comedy – Perform a comedy skit or sketch, either published material or original. Simple props and costumes are allowed. Content must be suitable for all ages/audiences.

String Orchestra Definition

A music group consisting solely of stringed instruments.

Piece Selection

- a) Competitors must **perform two (2) selections**, one of which was performed at the originating local festival and have received the recommendation of the local Adjudicator.
- b) The second selection is the competitor's own choice but must not be another movement from the first selection.
- c) Multi-movements of one piece will be counted as one selection.
- d) Selections must be musically contrasting. The Adjudicator will take choice of repertoire into consideration.
- e) Only one selection may have an instrumental solo passage.
- f) The instrumentation should be indicated if different from what appears in the score.
- g) A pdf of the original scores must be submitted with the registration. It must a complete original score in the correct key for all instruments in the performance.
- h) If not already in the score, bar numbers should be placed at the beginning of each line of music in the original score.

Small Ensembles

Definition

Small Ensembles are for groups with 4 to 15 members.

Examples of groups who can enter this class include but are not limited to:

- Small Bands
- Small Orchestras
- Garage/Rock Bands
- Small Choirs
- Glee Choirs
- Choral Speech
- Musical Theatre Ensembles
- Speech Arts Ensembles
- Brass Ensembles
- Woodwind Ensembles
- Ensembles made up of multiple instruments or the same instrument

Piece Selection

- a) Competitors must **perform either one (1) or two (2) selections,** one of which was performed at the originating local festival, received a minimum mark of 85 and have received the recommendation of the local Adjudicator.
- b) The second selection is optional and is the competitor's own choice but must not be another movement from the first selection.
- c) Only one selection may have a brief solo or solo ensemble passage. The total number of bars of a solo or solo ensemble passage(s) may not exceed 20% of the total length of the selection.
- d) Selections must be musically contrasting. The Adjudicator will take choice of repertoire into consideration.
- g) A pdf of the original scores must be submitted with the registration. It must be a complete original score in the correct key.
- h) If not already in the score, bar numbers should be placed at the beginning of each line of music in the original score.
